Sunday, 21 February 2010 09 am – approx 2 pm

Guided bus tour with authorised guide, Marianne Jarroff Prager.

Gather at the Great Synagogue at 9 am where Marianne will talk about the synagogue, its history and architecture. The bus will be waiting at Kungsträdgården and drive first to Gamla Stan. There, we will look at the first Synagogue and learn about the first Jewish inhabitants in Stockholm. We will also go to The German Church where many Jews baptised themselves in the 1600's. From Gamla Stan we travel to Södermalm where we will learn about the Jews who lived at Klippgatan 19. On Kungsholmen we visit Aronsberg, the oldest Jewish cemetery in Stockholm. We end the tour at the Jewish museum approx. 12pm. There we can buy sandwiches and coffee before we start a guided tour of the museum. We end the weekend with a glass of wine at the museum.
